**Goal 5:** Prioritize the investment of promoting racial equity to address social determinants of health, school readiness and family strengthening, including but not limited to continuing support for First 5 Sacramento programs that reduce the death of African American children.

### **FIRST 5 SACRAMENTO GENERAL UPDATES**

### **Bi-lingual Book Distribution**

With an investment from First 5 California, we distributed over 10,000 high-quality, bilingual books last month. Fifteen community agencies that serve children from low-income families picked up boxes of the books.

We're finally moving forward with a partnership with the River Cats, after it was put on hold during the pandemic. Much like our collaboration with the Sacramento Kings a couple of years ago, this small contract will allow us to get our message out about the importance of the first 5 years and to promote First 5 Sacramento. Over the next 10 months, we will have:





- Signage logo and tagline (Investing in our kids, Investing in our future) on all the changing stations in mens, womens and family restrooms
- Booster seat logo signage
- Sunday pre-game live announcement
- Concourse sign logo and tagline (You are your child's first teacher)
- 6 resource tabling events at games
- 2:15 second live read announcements during each game
- 2 Dinger appearances
- Social media posts
- 70 complimentary tickets to distribute to F5 families
- Corporate sponsor networking events

### **Home Visiting Coordination Collaborative (HVCC) Update**

The Commission-led countywide Home Visiting Coordination Collaborative (HVCC) is gaining strength with additional providers joining our bi-monthly meetings, and now through intentional, targeted outreach, we will be adding parents to the Collaborative. We recognize that community voice is critical to successfully identifying and eliminating barriers that families face in accessing home visiting and other support services. In addition, the Collaborative will plan a parent leadership training later this year.

### **Health Outcomes from Positive Experiences (HOPE) Update**

In May, First 5 convened over 80 community partners for an overview of Healthy Outcomes from Positive Experiences, otherwise known as (HOPE), which was hosted by the Tufts Medical Center. The HOPE framework includes four building blocks that mitigate the impact of trauma in early childhood. It's an asset based approach to building resilience in families by creating positive interactions. We're working with Tufts to convene 3 to 4 sector-specific trainings this fall for our partners in the health, early learning, family support and child welfare fields.

### Safe Sleep Baby 2.0

The Commission has been funding Safe Sleep Baby (SSB) since 2014 to educate the community and address the disparity in infant sleep related deaths, particularly in the African American community. In late 2020, Commission staff partnered with the Sacramento County Department of Child, Family, and Adult Services (DCFAS), the Child Abuse Prevention Council of Sacramento (CAPC), and the Black Child Legacy Campaign (BCLC) on a joint proposal to the California State Department of Social Services, Office of Child Abuse and Prevention (OCAP). The proposal, which requests \$250,000 per year for two years, is an expansion of the current SSB program. SSB 2.0 will focus on systems changes within DCFAS, increase access to services for vulnerable communities, and will provide opportunities for other communities to replicate our work.

### **Office Remodel**

The Building Lease Committee is working feverishly to transition into the new lease. The new lease approved by the Commission in May reduces the square footage by 30% and eliminates 8 offices or workspaces. A detailed timeline of tasks was put together and included surplus and donation of office furniture, recycling, scanning, computer/IT asset management, construction schedule, carpet and paint, and more. We aren't in the building yet, but should be within a few weeks. I'm happy to report that several funded partners and other nonprofits made appointments with County Surplus to pick up desks, chairs, books shelves and filing cabinets. It made us feel good to know that the First 5 office furniture will continue to be used by family serving agencies.

### **Unequal Birth Public Awareness Campaign Update**

We just wrapped up a six month Unequal Birth public awareness campaign, which performed very strongly, surpassing industry benchmarks across the board. The campaign, which brings awareness to the general public about racism as the root cause of birth inequities in Sacramento, will continue into the new strategic plan

period and is currently being audited through a partnership with Her Health First and RSE. A refreshed campaign will be highlighted later this year.

### Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) Public Awareness Campaign

First 5 partnered with SCOE on the development and execution of an ACEs Public Awareness Campaign. We used the Help Me Grow (HMG) platform as the hub to drive awareness about ACEs, with a refreshed website that now includes a dedicated ACEs Aware tab. Additionally, the website was translated into Spanish. Currently, we're working on a Spanish digital campaign to create awareness about the new Spanish language HMG/ACEs website.

### CA 2021-22 State Budget

The state budget provides unprecedented support for Early Learning and Care in California and makes historic investments in universal Transitional Kindergarten (TK) as well as other areas of the state's Early Learning and Care system. California's 2021-2022 budget aligns with the Biden-Harris Administration's proposals for investment in Early Learning and Care for families, found in its American Families Plan, which includes \$200 billion to expand Pre-K to all 3 and 4year-olds and \$225 billion to increase access to high-quality, affordable child care for young children. The CA state budget areas of focus for First 5 includes:

### **Child Care**

- A comprehensive package to stabilize and bolster the child care field through an array of strategies, such as:
  - annualizing an increase in provider reimbursement rates to 75% of the 2018 Regional Market Rate, and allocating one-time federal money to bring all providers to 85% for the next two years
  - adding 120,000 new child care slots in 2021-22, and increasing to 200,000 new slots by 2024-25
  - waiving family fees for one year
  - continuing hold harmless payment policies
  - expanding funding for child care facilities
- Provision of one-time funds for early childhood mental health consultation to support child care providers in addressing children's social-emotional development, using trauma-informed practices, and promoting health and wellbeing for children and families impacted by the pandemic

### Mental, Dental and Physical Health

- Five-year extension of Medi-Cal eligibility for postpartum individuals to 12 months after birth
- Creation of a Medi-Cal dyadic care benefit to improve preventive care for young children and their parents/caregivers, address social-emotional needs, and support maternal mental health
- Addition of doula services as a covered Medi-Cal benefit
- Addition of Community Health Workers to provide culturally responsive care to Medi-Cal clients
- Creation of a Children & Youth Behavioral Health Initiative to reimagine mental and behavioral health supports for individuals ages 0-25
- Continuation of financial support to work across systems to address adverse childhood experiences

 Managed Care Dental will continue in Sacramento and LA Counties through 2022 and, according to the CA Department of Health Care Services, there are no plans currently to move to Fee for Service.

### **Developmental Screening and Services**

- Extension of Early Start services for children with developmental delays up to age 5
- Continuation of Prop. 56 supplemental payments that incentivize well-child visits and screenings for ACEs and developmental delays

### Family Strengthening and Supports

- Extension of the current 60%-70% wage replacement for paid family leave for low-income families until the end of 2022
- Dedication of a total of \$12 billion in Golden State Stimulus payments that will reach two-thirds of Californians, with \$600 direct payments to all taxpayers who make up to \$75,000/year and didn't receive a first payment; and additional direct payments for families with dependents, including undocumented families
- Increase of the CalWORKs Maximum Aid Payment

### **Children in Foster Care**

- \$37 million augmentation of the Emergency Child Care Bridge Program for Foster Children to connect caregivers and parenting youth in foster care to child care
- \$80 million to support children and youth in foster care (through a \$1,500 pandemic stipend)
- \$100 million in additional resources for prevention services that strengthen families, reduce racial inequities, and reduce entries into foster care

### Revenue

- First 5 will continue to receive an appropriately fair share of the Vape Tax revenue in the new budget. This is a huge sigh of relief for us all and is the result of intensive education and advocacy for our legislators by First 5 staff and commissioners across the state.
- The \$20 million in one-time COVID Relief funding to the county First 5 Commissions for local early childhood systems integration did not move forward. The Association and County Commissions will continue to look at how to make the case for our value at the state level and may come back in later years with an ask of financial support.
