

Home Visiting Programs Eligibility/ Family Support Services Referrals and Continuum of Services

At any entry point, all families should be connected to an FRC and/or CIL (if African American) and a home visiting program that best meets their needs. Additionally, eligible families can be referred to other family support services needed on page 2.

Home Visiting Programs for Special Populations

At any entry point, families that are eligible for home visiting programs for special populations (SP) should first be offered or referred to the program that is most specialized in the families' needs. Families can be assessed and triaged based on eligibility, location, capacity and/or the need or desire for a nurse. Families with a desire or need for a nurse will be triaged by any of the Public Health (PH) Programs below for co-services. At the end of program term of the specialized program, families will be offered Birth & Beyond (B&B) for continued home visiting services and/or Head Start (HS) Home-Based. Head Start Home-Based can serve prenatal thru 5 years old only if family is income eligible. B&B does not have income guidelines.
